



Fleetwood Swimmers in North Lancs Championships Medal Haul.

Fleetwood Swimming Club had an impressive 34 swimmers qualify for the North Lancs Swimming Championships held recently at Palatine Pool. It proved to be a very successful 4 days for the club with their swimmers amassing a colossal 38 medals between them. The 13 Gold, 16 Silver and 9 Bronze were backed up with a huge combined total of 146 personal bests.

Liam Sutcliffe (pictured) was a sensation as he achieved 12 pbs from his 12 swims which resulted in him winning 5 gold and 4 silver medals. These performances secured him the award for best 13yo boy at the Championships.

Hot prospect Thomas Manning proved why he is highly rated amongst the coaches. He totally dominated his age category with his 8 pbs securing him 4 gold, 3 silver and best 9yo boy award.

10yo Bradley Sharples achieved 2 gold, 5 silver and 2 bronze medals. His 10 pbs gave him the 2nd place award in his age group which had a very strong field of 44 swimmers.

Hanna Roe, aged 10, was rewarded for her efforts in training with a superb haul of 2 gold, 1 silver and 3 bronze medals. She achieved a tremendous 11 pbs from her 11 swims. This enabled her to take 3rd place in her age group from a field of 39 swimmers.

Alex Myers' impressive silver and 2 bronze medals were sufficient to cement him 4th placed 12yo boy with 5 pbs.

16yo Jack Stanney once again showed his determination as he impressed in the 15 - 18 year old category finishing in a highly commendable 7th place out of 30 competitors. His 3 pbs included a silver and a bronze medal.

Gaby Davey picked up a well deserved silver medal in what proved to be a very exciting 200m fly race. Her 5 pbs placed her 11th in the 11yo girls age group.

Martha Hirst may have only entered 1 event but she swam an impressive pb in the heat and an equally impressive pb in the final to secure a bronze medal.

Tom Humphries (9th), Luke Waite (9th), Beth Manning (9th), Dom Roe (9th), William Eccleston (6th), Alex Jones-Wright (7th), Kyle Preece (9th), and Jack Hirst (7th) all performed superbly throughout to secure highly commendable top 10 finishes in their respective age groups.
