



Report for North Lancs Level 3 2009.

Fleetwood Swimming Club had an impressive 37 swimmers taking part at the North Lancashire level 3 swimming Championships held at Palatine pool recently. Between them they amassed a very creditable 172 personal best swims, 21 speeding tickets, 14 gold, 22 silver and 15 bronze medals. Phoebe Brown performed superbly to win the 12/13 year old girls skins event in addition to her impressive gold, silver and 2 bronze medal haul. Tommy Humphries dominated his age group to take 5 speeding tickets and a bronze medal. Hannah Roe was equally devastating in claiming 4 speeding tickets. Jack Hirst can be proud of his efforts in achieving 3 speeding tickets and 2 silver medals. Kieran Wade performed well on his way to 2 speeding tickets as did William Eccleston who won a speeding ticket, 3 gold and 2 bronze medals. Rebecca Williams obtained a speeding ticket and 2 gold medals whilst Rebecca Robinson was in fine form in winning a speeding ticket, gold, 4 silver and a bronze medal in addition to a very creditable 5th place finish in the skins event. Amy Butler impressed to win a speeding ticket, gold, and a silver medal. Katie Lawson and Ciara Barcock both won a speeding ticket apiece. Dominic Roe has 2 golds and silver as reward for his efforts. Harry Prestwich performed consistently to win a gold, 2 silver, 4 bronze medals and a 4th place finish in the boys skins whilst Gaby Davey impressed to take a gold and 2 silver medals. Luke Waite with a gold and a silver and Jack Price with a gold and a bronze medal both showed great character. Alex Jones-Wright has surely strengthened his grip on this year's most improved swimmer award with a sparkling 3 silvers, 2 bronze and a 3rd place in the boy's skins event. Maigan Banks and Lucy Wetherill performed consistently and were rewarded with silver and a bronze medal apiece. Ella Hesketh won a richly deserved silver medal whilst Beth Humphries and Charlotte Grogan impressed in winning a bronze medal each.

It was hugely pleasing for Coaches Elliott Myers, Charles Barber and Steve Brown to see all their hard work paying dividends with Elliott adding 'the kids should look to build on this and push on for the level 2 meet in the New Year. Coach Barber praised both 'the conduct and the performances of all the Fleetwood swimmers' adding 'the teams support for each other on poolside was a credit to themselves and the club.
